Re: Opposition to S.B. 6318

Dear Chairwoman Becker:

The National Association of Dental Plans (NADP) represents dental plans covering more than 4.2 million Washingtonians, or 61 percent of the population, with dental coverage. We are concerned with the possible precedent set by Senate Bill 6318, which was just heard in your committee on January 25, 2016. NADP hopes you and your colleagues will take our opposition into consideration as the bill develops within your committee.

As drafted, S.B. 6318 proposes amendments to Washington statute which will disrupt dental services for many Washingtonians without cause. NADP understands and appreciates dentists who want to be assured their clinical and ownership decisions are not questioned; however, these proposed changes have a much greater scope, especially when compared to methods employed within other states.

Currently, there are Dental Service Organizations (DSO) which provide business operations for dental offices. DSOs are becoming a more popular option for dentists who do not want to be burdened with the administrative and business requirements of owning a small business, but prefer to focus on providing the best patient care. This trend is similar to that experienced in the medical field more than a decade ago. The structure of this bill seems to modify this business model, with the distinct purpose of making DSOs less competitive to the current standard practice of dental care.

NADP would appreciate further dialog with the committee to better understand the repercussions of S.B. 6318, as it is necessary to develop a structure which provides safeguards for dentists while allowing flexibility for managing the administration of a dental office.









## **Dental Benefits Impact Consumer Behavior**


**Who Has Dental Benefits**
